## 3D Printing in Manufacturing (3D Printer) (\$3,000.00)

Ryan Volke and Taylor Last, Tech Ed Teachers - Port Washington High School

**Project:** This project will immediately provide increased student project completion with better attention to detail by allowing even more students in all areas of technology education to effectively solve design projects. In all Tech Ed courses, students will be able to design custom pieces for their projects. CAD students will be able to model three-dimensional projects. Machining and Casting students will be able to make molds prior to casting metal. The overall impact to student learning will be immense and ongoing.

#### Digital Keyboard Transition (2 Keyboards) (\$1,890.00)

**Project:** The High School Music Department is in the process of replacing current upright acoustic pianos in the band and choir rooms with digital pianos. Digital pianos do not have reoccurring tuning expenses and have several features that will be extremely beneficial to the students. These features include recording and playback, numerous voices, and increased portability, which will enhance the music experience for students in both choir and band.

# Academic Career Planning (ACP) "Making a Difference by Connecting the World of Work with Careers & Community Engagement" (\$1,525.00)

Our school district was fortunate to be one of 25 pilot schools that helped implement the curriculum and program for ACP. This will help students be aware of and understand the needs within their community, as well as see themselves as an active participant in the community.

#### Spirit System - Interactive Assessment System (\$3,409.00)
